- 1 Large Roll of Clear Contact Paper to Cover Workbooks –Please Keep Home- Workbooks will be sent home for you to cover.

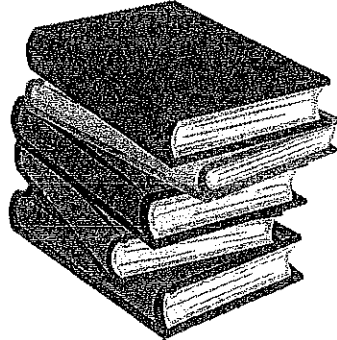
Please take all supplies out of the packaging wrap and label all supplies with your child's initials.
